



How many generators are there in the East African power station



Overview

Our analysis shows that at least 49GW of power generation capacity will be added in sub-Saharan African countries between 2023 and 2027. East Africa will lead the way with some 14. Thermal sources came in second, accounting for 18. 59% of total installed capacity. Tanzania is the only country with natural gas. In Tanzania, the Julius Nyerere project began operations, with six of nine new 235MW units commissioned during the year. The Grand Ethiopian Renaissance Dam added 800MW with its third and fourth units, while Uganda's 600MW Karuma and Cameroon's 420MW Nachtigal plants were fully commissioned.
