Small wind turbines require an annual average wind speed of at least 9 miles per hour (mph) or 4 meters per second (m/s), while utility-scale turbines need an annual average wind speed of at least 13 mph (5. However these turbines are generally smaller, don't generate as much energy, and are not designed to withstand higher wind ranges.
